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## **After announcement Perdue leads by 10 percent**

**Raleigh, N.C.** – Lt. Governor Beverly Perdue announced her campaign for Governor on October 1 and according to a Public Policy Polling survey taken two days later her lead in the Democratic Primary is ten percent. She leads State Treasurer Richard Moore 39% to 29% among likely Democratic Primary voters. One month ago she led by seven percent.

In the Republican gubernatorial primary, Bill Graham continues to lead with 19%, but Fred Smith's support grew significantly up to 17%. Bob Orr was third with 11%.

In the Democratic Presidential Primary, Hillary Clinton leads John Edwards for the second consecutive month, but her lead is well within the margin of error. Clinton received the support of 32% of respondents, Edwards received 31%, and Barack Obama 20%.

Fred Thompson keeps his large lead in the Republican presidential race. Thirty-one percent of Republican primary voters chose Thompson, 20% chose Rudy Giuliani, and 11% each chose John McCain and Mitt Romney.

In addition to tracking the Democratic Lieutenant Governor's race, PPP began tracking the Democratic State Superintendent race and the Democratic and Republican races for State Treasurer.

PPP surveyed 621 likely Democratic primary voters and 755 likely Republican primary voters on October 3. The surveys have margins of error of  $\pm 3.9\%$  and  $\pm 3.5\%$  respectively. Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
