#### **McCrory leads GOP Field**

**Raleigh, N.C.** – Charlotte Mayor Pat McCrory, rumored to be announcing next week that he will run for Governor, would begin his campaign with a small lead.

Public Policy Polling's newest survey shows that McCrory would have 18%, closely followed by Fred Smith at 16% and Bill Graham with 13%.

"Republican voters have not been particularly enamored with their current choices for Governor," said Public Policy Polling President Dean Debnam. "It looks like they want to give the new guy a shot."

The Governor's race was also polled without McCrory included. In that race Smith led Graham 21-17, with Bob Orr at 11%.

In the Presidential race, John McCain vaulted from his 8% showing in a December PPP survey up to 26. That puts him just behind leader Mike Huckabee whose 16 point lead from last month is down to one in this poll.

"Our results indicate that Mike Huckabee might have a hard time getting to the GOP nomination by racking up lopsided victories in the southern states," said Debnam. "McCain's win in New Hampshire seems to have generated more momentum than Huckabee's performance in Iowa."


In the Republican Lieutenant Governor's race former Congressional candidate Greg Dority holds a small lead over senator Robert Pittenger 19-17. In the Treasurer's race, Bill Daughtridge leads fellow legislator Dale Folwell 17-11.

PPP surveyed 978 likely Republican primary voters on January 9th. The survey has a margin of error of  $\pm$  3.1%. Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
