Open Field for Ohio Senate Seat

Raleigh, N.C. – A new Public Policy Polling survey finds that most of the frequently discussed possibilities for the Senate seat being vacated by George Voinovich are not very well known to the state's voters.

49% of respondents have no opinion one way or the other about likely GOP hopeful Rob Portman. Among those who do, voters are relatively split, with 28% holding a favorable view of Portman and 23% seeing him negatively.

Among Democrats the most well liked and well known candidate is Lieutenant Governor Lee Fisher. 40% have a positive view of him, while 32% see him unfavorably. For Secretary of State Jennifer Brunner it's a 34/36 spread and it's 26/27 for Congressman Tim Ryan.

In head to head matches with each of the Democrats Portman leads, with a two point edge over Fisher, a six point advantage over Ryan and an eight point margin relative to Brunner.

The biggest reason for Portman's early advantage is that Republican voters seem to be pretty much lined up behind him, while Democrats aren't sure about their early loyalties. Portman gets 74-80% of the Republican vote against each Democrat, while Brunner, Fisher, and Ryan get just 59-68% of the Democratic vote against him.


"What's clear for the 2010 Ohio Senate race is that nothing is clear," said Dean Debnam, President of Public Policy Polling. "None of these candidates are very well known statewide, and that means it's going to be a close race with no run away favorite."

PPP surveyed 578 Ohio voters on January 17th and 18th. The survey's margin of error is +/-4.1%. Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
